But, our prayers still act as a comfort and a help to us because they help us to see that we are not God; that we can't control everything; that we do not always determine the course of our own lives. God is in charge and we must trust Him even when things seem to be turning out awfully. Our prayers connect us to Him, they calm us and they help us to try to look at the world through eyes of faith.
