

FROM THE PASTOR



We hear a lot in the readings this week about the call of God. Lots of us acknowledge that we were called by God to be His children. Most of us didn't hear that call as infants. Our parents made that decision for us. But, at some point in our lives we have all listened for the call of God and we have

decided to respond. It could have been at our Confirmation, or when we decided to get married in the Church, or when we had to make the decision to have our children baptized. For others, like myself, it involved following the vocation to priesthood, or the Religious Life. But, God always calls to us and we, using our free will, have to respond to that call.

Of course, we can also use that free will to reject the call of God, to run from it or simply to ignore it in the hopes that it will go away. God is unrelenting, however. He will not force us but He will always seek us and pursue us and invite us to be His disciples.

But we are in the driver's seat. Discipleship is a decision; it is a choice. We must make it and then we must follow through on it. That's often not easy. Nevertheless, just because something isn't easy doesn't mean it isn't worthwhile. In fact, if you think about it, I'm sure you'll agree that most often in life the things that are the most worthwhile are also the most difficult.

So, don't lose heart when following the Lord seems difficult. It is! But, the One who calls us is also our companion of the trip. He also guides us, guards us and sustains us each and every step of the way. We may not always sense His presence but those are usually the times that we have wandered off away from Him. When we turn back to Him we'll find He is always there, always waiting, and always willing to have us back.
