FROM THE PASTOR



Veni, Veni, Emmanuel...
O Come, O Come, Emmanuel...

We begin another year of grace in the Church and the liturgical calendar once again goes back to the beginning as we

recount the story of our salvation. Advent is, for many people, including myself, a favorite time of the year. It is, by far, my favorite season of the Church year filled as it is with hopefulness and anticipation. These days leading us toward the celebration of the Lord's Birth reassure us because we are telling the story again about something that has already happened. Christ has visited His people and brought with Him the possibility of salvation.

This season, like its counterpart, the season of Lent, is one of penance. Why? Because the Church always recommends doing acts of penance in preparation for any great celebration. Like Lent this feast used to include fasting and abstaining from meat (that's why there are customs for many ethnic groups to eat only fish on Christmas Eve...because the penance wasn't over until Christmas Day itself) but for the most part that no longer happens.

In fact, everyone seems to be in such a hurry to get going celebrating Christmas that this time of year now includes more parties and feasting than any other time. It's hard to see any evidence of Advent preparation and anticipation anymore.

That's why we try to maintain a sense of it at least here in church so you can experience that when you come to Mass. The liturgical color is a penitential purple; there are unbleached candles on the altar; there are no flowers or overt decorations in the sanctuary; the "Gloria" is committed from Mass, etc.

These things help, at least in a small way, to remind us that we should spend these four short weeks of Advent preparing ourselves, watching, praying and waiting. We await the celebration of an accomplished fact. Namely, the coming of the Messiah. God takes on flesh to live among us as "Emmanuel", a name that means "God-Is-With-Us".

Despite the troubles of the world, the divisions in our society, the continuing pandemic that concerns and frightens us and a host of other troubles...God is with us and will never abandon us.

Have a Blessed Advent Season and a blessed week ahead. Keep the Faith!
