



The Lord is Risen! Alleluia!

We continue to celebrate the great feast of our redemption. Easter lasts *fifty days* 

and today we celebrate the Octave of Easter, also known as "Low Sunday" and also Divine Mercy Sunday. While that last devotion —to Divine Mercy— may not be observed by everyone it has, since the pontificate of St. John Paul II, become a devotion to which many Catholics are attached.

The resurrection of the Lord is so great a mystery and also so great a gift that celebrating it on one day just simply isn't enough. As we spent 40 days in penance preparing for Easter now we go even farther and spend 50 days proclaiming the glory of the resurrection. Christ is alive in our lives and in our world. We must all strive to live in the grace that comes from that saving act.

I hope you have been celebrating and will go on celebrating that the Lord is risen and that your Paschal-tide is filled with grace and blessings. Remember to Keep the Faith!
