We will close out this year by celebrating our sesquicentennial with the Bishop. So, please mark your calendars NOW and plan to be here to celebrate.

BLESSING OF CANDLES

On Wednesday, February 2 the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This day is also known as "Candlemas Day". It commemorates the time that the child Jesus was presented in the Temple by His parents. A prophetess who saw Him said He would be a "Light to the Nations and the glory of Israel". Because of that image of light the Church blesses candles on that day.

The Blessing of Candles will take place at 9:00 am Mass on Wednesday. If you have candles that you would like to have blessed for your own use then you may feel free to bring them to Mass that day and have them blessed.

It is customary to keep blessed candles in the house in order to have one lit if/when a priest comes to visit the sick and also to light during an oncoming storm as a symbol of prayer against danger or damage.

I hope you are all doing well and staying safe and healthy. Remember that the Parish Office will be **CLOSED** all week this coming week. Our Secretary, Laura, needed to take some personal time this week so we are closing the Office while

she is out.

Please see the notices elsewhere in this bulletin about the Blessing of Candles on <u>February 2</u> and the Blessing of Throats on <u>February 3</u>.

The créche and tree in the Narthex will be coming down this weekend in anticipation of the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (aka Candlemas Day) on February 2. By ancient custom the Christmas créche was left up from Christmas until Candlemas. Also, this year we decided to leave the tree up as well. And, much to our surprise the poinsettias have done remarkable well this year too so we left them in place as long as we could to get the most out of them. But, with Candlemas coming this week on Wednesday the time has come to put away these reminders of Our Lord's Incarnation so that we can soon prepare for the celebration of His Passion by the 40-day season of Lent.

<u>Saturday, February 5</u> is the *Feast of St. Agatha*. She is the patroness of those with diseases of the breast, such as breast cancer, and also of bell makers. This is because part of the torture of her martyrdom included having her breast ripped off with iron hooks. The Lord miraculously restored her breast and her health before she was eventually burned alive. I have a great devotion to this Sicilian martyr because of my membership in the Military Order of the Collar of St. Agatha, a dynastic order of chivalry which was bestowed on me in 2004.

But, being a member of that chivalric order or not Agatha's life serves as a great reminder of the power of faith and trust in the Lord as well as the faithfulness of the Lord to those who serve Him. We can overcome so many things, even the suffering of this world, if we place our lives in His hands and our total faith in Him.

I hope this week ahead is filled with blessings for you and that you, and all those you love, will remain safe and free of harm or illness. Above all else, whatever happens, remember to Keep the Faith!
