Total Number of households making a gift is 98.



FROM THE PASTOR



So now summer has actually begun, not just in the conventional wisdom of "post Memorial Day" but also on the calendar since the Summer Solstice has passed. In the summer time one of the biggest feasts of the Church occurs in the coming

week. Wednesday, June 29 is the Feast of Saints Peter & Paul. These two early giants of the Church are considered the two pillars of the Church in Rome. As such their leadership is extolled and, although not necessarily martyred on the same day (Peter by being crucified upside down and Paul by beheading) their feast has been a joint one since ancient times.

We would probably go to confession to Peter sooner than to any of the other apostles. He is perhaps a more striking example of the simple fact of holiness. Jesus says to us as he said, in effect, to Peter: "It is not you who have chosen me, but I who have chosen you. Peter, it is not human wisdom that makes it possible for you to believe, but my Father's revelation. I, not you, build my Church." Paul's experience of the risen Jesus on the road to Damascus was the driving force that made him one of the most zealous, dynamic, and courageous ambassadors of Christ the Church has ever had. But persecution, humiliation, and weakness became his day-by-day carrying of the cross, material for further transformation. The dying Christ was in him; the living Christ was his life.

Have a week ahead filled with blessings. Saints Peter & Paul: pray for us! And remember above all to Keep The Faith!

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

A reminder that in order to receive Holy Communion worthily and in a state of proper preparedness <u>it is required</u> that we fast from all food and drink for one hour prior to receiving Holy Communion. Water is an exception to that and also so is medication.

However, breath mints, hard candy, and chewing gum violate the Communion fast! You may not be chewing gum during Mass, or sucking on a piece of candy or a breath mint and then also come forward to receive Holy Communion. If you inadvertently break the fast (by chewing gum, for example) and realize it after Mass has begun you should not receive at that Mass. Don't just dismiss it and think, "Oh well, I didn't mean to do it so it doesn't matter."

It matters.

The regulations used to be that in order to receive one had to fast from Midnight the night before. Now, the rule is that you have to fast for just one hour. This is an easy rule with which to comply. All it requires is that you be mindful of what you are doing and also have proper respect for the Eucharist.

Remember: receiving Communion is <u>not</u> your right; it is a gift and a privilege!
