NJ SAFE HAVEN LAW

Under the NJ Safe Haven Protection Act a person may give up an unwanted infant anonymously. The purpose of Safe Haven is to protect unwanted babies from being killed or hurt from an unsafe environment. A distressed parent who is unable to care for an infant can give up custody of a baby less than 30 days old safely, legally and anonymously. All that is required is that the baby be brought to any hospital emergency room, police station, fire station, ambulance, first aid or rescue squad in NJ that are staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week. As long as the child shows no signs of intentional abuse, no name or other information is required. The parent can call the Safe Haven Hotline - 1-877-839-2339 - and get the address and directions to any of the locations mentioned above within the state.

FROM THE PASTOR



Christ is Risen! Alleluia!

We congratulate our 8th graders who, last weekend, received the Sacrament of Confirmation. This coming Saturday our 2nd graders will receive their First Holy

Communion. May God bless them and their families as they prepare to take this next important step in their Christian Initiation.

Remember that beginning this year the Ascension of the Lord will not take place on a Thursday but has been moved to the following Sunday. The Ascension will be celebrated this year on Sunday, May 29.

There is a lot in the news lately about the Supreme Court of the United States considering the repeal of the Roe v. Wade decision that paved the way for legalized abortion on demand in the United States. The Church is, of course, staunchly pro-life. We believe that all children have the right to be alive. Many people criticize the Church for being merely "pro-birth" but doing little or nothing to help pregnant women in need or to help their children in need.

Nothing could be farther from the truth! The Church provides all kinds of pre-natal and post-natal care to women and children in crisis and/or in need. We have Catholic hospitals, pregnancy centers, women's shelters, adoption agencies, addiction resources and aid, food banks, Homes and Shelters for abused women, the St. Vincent de Paul Society and that's only to name but a few. Most of these are available for free and regardless of religious affiliation.

The Church doesn't just preach to people in the abstract. We put what we say into practice every single day. Abortion is a moral question and the civil law cannot determine whether or not something is right. It can only define whether or not something is legal. The Church will always be opposed to abortion on demand. However, that does not mean that we don't recognize the very real need for alternative assistance to those considering an abortion. Instead we are doing all we can to give women in need a viable option...a true CHOICE.

Remember: abortion is not just an issue of "women's rights". It is an issue of HUMAN RIGHTS.

In the week ahead may God fill you with blessings. Hug your children and pray for those who are facing a time of crisis and need our help. Above all: Keep the Faith!
