CELEBRATION OF OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE


The Hispanic Ministry will be hosting a fiesta on Saturday, December 10.

FROM THE PASTOR



Veni, Veni, Emmanuel...

With those ancient words (O Come, O Come, Emmanuel) the Church once again begins a new year and celebrates the Season of Advent in anticipation of

the great feast of the Lord's Incarnation: Christmas!

We have all just gotten through our typically American holiday of Thanksgiving. Perhaps you might still be feeling the after effects of stuffing your face on Thanksgiving Day? And, of course the commercial retailers are, and have been, out in force selling their wares in a season they count on to pay their bills.

In the outside world (by which I mean the world outside of church) we have now left Thanksgiving behind and are focused on Christmas. On TV, on the internet, on the radio, etc. it's as if Christmas has already come. It's also true that many people just simply love Christmas so much that they begin to celebrate early.

That's "out there"...

In here; within the church, the story is a different one. We now undertake to spend four weeks watching, waiting, preparing and increasing a growing sense of joy during these days of Advent. Of course the word Advent means "an arrival" or "a coming" and these four short weeks are an opportunity for us to contemplate the enormity of what is coming.

It's fair to say that Advent provides us with a much needed respite from the frantic activity going on in the world around us. Rather than scaring us, that should fill us with a sense of hope because there is still this present time for us to live as He has taught us.

I hope that in these very busy days that lie ahead you will use the opportunities presented to you to come to Mass and take a break from the craziness. I pray that God fills your hearts and your lives with a growing sense of hope and a quiet sense of joy.
