Just now, Tuesday afternoon, I am packed and ready to go out the door for the Convocation. And just now, Laura has reminded me to write my column for the bulletin. So this will be short, if you can believe that!

A convocation is when priest from the diocese join the bishops for a few days. What do we do during the convocation? Check-in begins at 2:00pm today. At 2:30 a mobile Health Unit from St. Peter's Hospital is available to do things like administer a flu shot, check blood pressure and cholesterol of priests, offer nutritional counseling, answer medical and pharmaceutical questions and more. At 3:15 today Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is available. At 4:15 there will be a presentation followed by Evening Prayer. Then dinner and social time. Tomorrow will be two presentations, Morning and Evening Prayer, Mass, Adoration, the opportunity to go to Confession for the priests as well as meals and social time. On Thursday, breakfast and lunch will be served, there will be Morning Prayer, a presentation to the priests by the bishop and Mass. All will depart for their parishes throughout the diocese after lunch.

I should say, that the convocation in our Diocese of Metuchen, takes place each year at Spring Lake, down the shore. It's always very pleasant enjoyable, refreshing and replenishing! I look forward to arriving there right after I stop at the ShopRite, drop off some groceries for my father and stop at the post office, all on my way there.

TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 25:6-10a

This passage describes the new Jerusalem as a heavenly banquet on the mountain with the Lord God wiping away all tears.

Second Reading: Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20

In simple, direct words, Paul thanks the Philippians for alleviating his hardships. He stresses, though, that he is as accustomed to poverty as to abundance and finds all his strength in Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 22:1-14

Once more speaking to the chief priests and the elders, Jesus relates the parable of the wedding banquet. A King, preparing a wedding banquet for his son, summons all the invited guests. When, after several invitations, no guests arrive, the King commands his servants to "go out into the byroads and invite anyone you come upon." Again, Jesus warns the elders, "the invited are many, the elect are few."
