MOTHER'S DAY FLOWER SALE




Tomato plants and flowers will also be available for purchase on the dates of the sale. Thank you for supporting the Youth Group.

Thank you to all who have given so generously to the 2021 Bishop's Annual Appeal. FROM THE PASTOR



Christ is Risen! Alleluia!

I hope your Easter Season is continuing to go well. This coming Wednesday, <u>April 21</u>, in addition to being the feast of St. Anselm is also "Secretaries' Day". I

want to take a few moments to talk about our Parish Secretary, Laura Torres, and how much she does for our parish.

When I was appointed to come here to this parish a person on the diocesan staff told me, "You're very lucky. You're getting one of the best secretaries in the whole diocese!" In the years I have been here I have discovered that person was putting it mildly. I have worked in quite a few parishes in our diocese -eight to be exact- as well as in at least seven others in different parts of the country and I have rarely encountered someone who does the job Laura does and who does it so well, so efficiently and who also keeps such a good attitude and sense of humor while doing it.

She frequently puts in extra hours when asked (and sometimes volunteers to do so when *not* asked!); she runs the office by doing tasks that really should be covered by two people; she frequently gets phone calls at her home outside office hours (...and, by the way everyone, please *stop* doing that!) or gets button holed when someone sees her around town like in Shoprite or some other place and she always handles that with grace and good cheer.

She is the "front line" of our parish. Phone calls or drops ins to the office that come without warning or introduction are all fielded by her with good manners. Frequently, she gets the brunt of peoples' rude comments or angry complaints when they say things to her they wouldn't <u>dare</u> say to me. Each and every time she keeps right on going doing her job well. In six years I have never seen her allow the pressures of her job (and there are many) get to her or cause her to become bitter or resentful. She's only human and may feel that way at times but she never brings that to work with her.

Simply put, the person at the diocese who mentioned her to me was telling the truth. She is one of the best secretaries in the diocese, and one of the best I have ever encountered. She doesn't just help me but she does a great deal for all of you. As I always say: she really runs this parish; I just say the Masses. So, we wish Laura Torres a happy Secretaries' Day and we all say **THANK YOU**, Laura! Our prayerful best wishes and our gratitude this week and always.
