KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS


The Knights of Columbus will be sponsoring a **Take-Out Fish Fry** on Friday, February 26.

NOTE: There will be a maximum of 110 people allowed at each Mass and the bathrooms in church remain CLOSED.

OBLIGATIONS FOR LENT

So that the Church may be spiritually one in a common observance of Lent, the following days of fast and abstinence are to be observed by all Catholics of the Diocese of Metuchen who enjoy the blessings of good health:

- 1. The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. In this parish our patronal day, which is a solemnity, <u>St. Joseph's Day on March 19</u> is a Friday. As Pastor I inform you that you do not have to abstain from meat that day but, if you wish you may either abstain from meat on another day that week -OR- abstain from meat for two out of the three meals you will have that day and have meat at your principal meal. <u>This applies to Friday, March 19 ONLY!</u>
- 3. From the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday until the celebration of the Easter Vigil on the evening of Holy Saturday, the Easter fast should be observed so that, with uplifted and welcoming hearts, we may be ready to celebrate the joys of the Resurrection.
- 4. The obligation to fast applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59. To fast in the Catholic Tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal during the day so as to experience hunger.

The obligation of abstinence affects all Catholics who have reached the age of 14 and for the rest of their lives. Abstinence in the Catholic Tradition means to abstain from meat.

The obligation of fast and abstinence, as a whole, is a serious obligation. While failure to observe any one penitential day in itself may not be considered serious, the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of them without good cause, would be considered a grave matter. Those unable to abstain for a valid reason on any given Friday of Lent are asked to perform some other penitential act, or to abstain on another day.

FROM THE PASTOR



"Lord, who throughout these 40 days for us did fast and pray; teach us to discipline our wills and close by you to stay..."

Thus begins an old and favorite Lenten hymn as we once again enter into the prayer and penance of Lent. This is the time of year to

hit the "reset" button of your life. It's a time to pray more; to fast from many things including food; to abstain from eating meat on Fridays; to give alms to the poor and assistance to those less fortunate than ourselves.

These days are a time for us to draw closer to the Lord and try to purify ourselves by self-denial and sacrifice in order to make a good preparation to enter into the celebration of Easter worthily. Each year the Church throughout the world undertakes this form of spiritual "Spring Cleaning" (the word "Lent" means springtime) so that we have the opportunity to shake off the dust and cobwebs of our souls and practice those virtuous acts that help us to atone for our sinfulness and openly accept the mercy and forgiveness offered to us by the beautiful Paschal Mystery of Christ's passion, death and resurrection.

As a parish you have all been making sacrifices already, especially during these past twelve months of the pandemic. This, of course, includes the past five weeks in which there has not been the opportunity to come inperson to worship at Mass here at your parish church. I know this has been difficult for many of you.

As so many people have been hoping, the surge in Covid-19 cases, hospitalizations and deaths that befell us after Christmas has abated. I am glad that, as difficult as the past five weeks have been for many, if not most of you, it is over with and we are happily returned to our full schedule of Masses open for people to attend. Yes, we still have some restrictions that are necessary: Maximum capacity at each Mass is 110 people; face masks MUST be worn; hand sanitizer should be used by EVERYONE on entering church; the rest rooms remain CLOSED; Singing is still minimal and Holy Communion will be distributed at the end of Mass so you may receive and then immediately leave the church building.

These were all in place beginning in June except that the maximum capacity was slightly higher then because there was more seating in the cry room that has since been removed. So, we are back in church which is good news. We are also remaining cautious and vigilant for the sake of everyone's health. That's good news too.
