# FROM THE PASTOR



Most of you know by now, or at least you should know, that we are experiencing a priest shortage in this country. We don't have nearly as many priests as we need to minister to people adequately. Even a relatively small parish like ours really

should have two priests. While a few parishes in our diocese have more than one priest there is a large and growing number of parishes served by only one priest.

We are trying to cover things as best as we can but it is a struggle. I am fearful that because a shortage of priests has been discussed for so long while, at the same time, we have made a concerted effort to maintain a consistent level of service that many don't truly realize how bad the situation has become.

It may not happen much in our area but there are parts of this country where they only have Mass once a week, and some where even the Sunday Mass rotates and happens in different churches each Sunday while the priest in charge of three, four, or even five churches at once travels between them. But here in the northeast people are still receiving weekly and even daily Mass with little or no inconvenience.

And I fear that is a part of the problem. Everyone expects that Mass will always be available when they want it no matter what. But that comes with a cost. For example, I just got back from a 5 day vacation—the first vacation I have taken since February of 2020. But, because everyone expects all the same things to happen here even when I'm away it cost the parish \$755.00 to pay the priests we brought in to cover for me while I took my earned vacation. And this was a **short** vacation of just five days! Imagine the cost if I had been away for two weeks?

Of course, Sunday Mass must continue to occur even when I'm not here but I wonder why we can't simply make do with not having a daily Mass here when I am away? Omitting those would have saved us some \$250.00 and it's not like there aren't plenty of other churches nearby to which people could go just for the few days that I'm gone.

When those of you who work take your well-deserved vacation someone else who is employed by your employer covers for you and they are already on the payroll. You aren't expected to find your own coverage—<u>AND</u> pay them! But, that's what happens in the Church because I don't have another priest assigned here with me. I am putting this in front of you to prayerfully consider: maybe when I am away our parish could simply not have daily Mass? It would be mildly inconvenient for those who like to go to Mass every day and it would also mean we'd save some money. I think that as long as there is a vocation crisis—and there is—in this country it might be one thing that we could consider.
