FROM THE PASTOR



At last we have moved successfully through the Easter season; we have had our celebration of the Sacraments of initiation (First Holy Communion and Confirmation); and we have begun the season of Ordinary Time.

This season, when the Church calendar assumes the regular order of things (hence the name "Ordinary Time") begins in a very un-ordinary way with the celebration of two great theological feasts. They are today's <u>Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity</u> and next Sunday's <u>Solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ</u>, aka "Corpus Christi".

These theological feasts give us an opportunity to reflect on the nature of God and the greatest manifestation of His love for us found in the Eucharist, which is the gift of His very self.

They come at what is a transitional moment in the liturgical calendar as we move from the Easter season into the longest season of the year in Ordinary Time. They also come at a moment on the civil calendar when we move into the summer months. We have already observed the unofficial start of summer with Memorial Day. The season of summer (here in the Northern Hemisphere) may not actually occur until the summer solstice on <u>June 21</u> but the collective sensibility is that we are already into the summer.

Which brings me to my point: in the 25 years I have been a priest I have noticed that every summer the churches get a little more empty. This is particularly true in these days when we still operate under something of the shadow of Covid. But, even before Covid this phenomenon existed. It's as if people just decide that in summer going to Mass is optional.

It isn't.

As I do each and every year it's time for my annual reminder that God never takes a vacation from you. So, I urge you and I ask you please not to become remiss about the obligation to attend Mass and celebrate the Eucharist in the summer months. Being on vacation doesn't dispense you from your Sunday obligation. If you will be traveling and you don't know if you'll be able to find a Mass, or if you think your travel might prevent you from getting to Mass then come and speak with me. I can assist you in finding a church and the Mass schedule near where you will be -OR- I can dispense you from the obligation before you go if necessary.

Have a great week ahead. Enjoy the nicer weather and, for those of you who have some time off this summer, enjoy the time off. Above all things -even in the off timesremember to Keep the Faith!
