# FROM THE PASTOR



O Sacrament Most Holy! O Sacrament Divine! All praise and all thanksgiving be every moment Thine.

That old hymn helps us to celebrate the Solemnity the Church keeps today: The

Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ, more commonly called "Corpus Christi".

Having celebrated the great Paschal Mystery of the passion, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus Christ, and having celebrated the coming of the Holy Spirit we then celebrated a feast in honor of the true nature of God in the Trinity.

Now we come to another "theological feast" and we celebrate the abiding presence of the Triune God in His Church by means of the great gift of the Eucharist. This Sacrament is no mere symbol. We do not merely recreate the Last Supper of the Lord as a way of remembering Him and honoring what He taught us.

Rather, the Eucharist is the Body and Blood; Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ truly present here with us and becoming the spiritual food we need to guide and sustain us in this life. The Mass is a participation in the one sacrifice that Jesus made of Himself on the cross. It is not a new sacrifice offered over and over each time Mass is celebrated. Rather, it is our participation in that one bloody sacrifice of Himself that Christ made on the cross presented over and over again in an un-bloody way.

So, at each Mass we are becoming participants in that one sacrifice and experiencing the gift of the grace that flows throughout time from that one great act of love and redemption offered by Jesus who Himself became the Priest; the Victim and the Altar of Sacrifice by His glorious death.

This is why the Eucharist (which means "thanksgiving") is the central act of worship in the Church and the focal point of our lives as Catholic Christians.

We must never take for granted the enormity of this gift to us. Paul's Letter to the Romans reminds us that "While we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." There is nothing we can do to merit this gift. In fact we *don't* deserve it and it most certainly isn't a "right". This is why all of us must be vigilant to ensure that we prepare to receive this Sacrament of Salvation with a good disposition, properly formed, with a clear conscience and in humility.

May the week ahead be filled with graces and blessings flowing from the Eucharist. May God bless each of you and your families with His Presence and also with His Peace. Remember to do your part as well and in all things strive to **Keep The Faith!**
