FROM THE PASTOR



Our 150th Anniversary weekend is finally here! It is wonderful to have Bishop Checchio here to celebrate with us. My sincere thanks go out to all the people who have given of their time and their work to help make today a

meaningful celebration. To Laura, our Parish Secretary who, as always, has kept the info and the activities flowing; to our Deacons, liturgical ministers and wonderful Music Ministry for their efforts in helping with the liturgy. A special word of thanks goes to our Parish Trustee, John Rolak, for chairing the Sesquicentennial Luncheon Committee and to all the Committee members for their many efforts to coordinate the luncheon following the Anniversary Mass.

While I'm taking a moment to thank people I want to express my sincere thanks to Terry Finnegan and Joe Leggio for all the recent work they did on the Parish Property. They worked last week to close three groundhog burrows by the parish center and by the church. They also cleared 90 percent of the pine needles from the parish center roof and cleaned the gutters over both of the main doors. In addition they mulched a lot of leaves, which will be used at the Washington community garden. In that garden the plots that the Knights of Columbus helped sponsor produced over 1,200 pounds fresh, organic produce this past season.

There are lots of projects like these that need attention from time to time. Since we don't have a Maintenance Person on staff we are dependent on parishioners like **YOU** getting involved to help with these projects. Our Parish Capital Campaign has slowed down a bit as of late but it is still ongoing. As of the writing of this bulletin the total amount pledged so far is: \$390,616.00. The total of what we have received in payments on those pledges is: \$233,104.42.

That means we only have a little over \$200,000 in pledges to go in order to reach our goal of \$600,000. But, right now we do not yet have enough money on hand to begin any of the work projects. So, if you have not yet made a pledge to the Campaign please consider doing so as soon as possible. We need everyone to help in this effort!

I hope that the week ahead for you and your families is filled with good things and blessings from God. Remember in this month of November to pray for the dead, especially the poor souls in Purgatory. Also remember above all to Keep The Faith!
