

FROM THE PASTOR



The holiest of weeks is upon us. With this Palm Sunday weekend our Lenten journey now enters its final and most intense phase. We rehearse again the dramatic, powerful and tragic events that lead Christ through His Passion and Death and into His glorious

Resurrection. These are the days in which our salvation was won. These are the days that changed the course of human history.

The schedule for the Sacred Triduum is in this bulletin and was also mailed to you at home. The special liturgies of Holy Week are *not* holy days of obligation. However, you are obviously invited and strongly encouraged to participate in as many of them as you are able. Even if you cannot make it to all of them I strongly urge you to try to come to the Solemn Liturgy of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday at 3:00pm.

Please take note of two things: 1) there are THREE Masses in English on Easter Sunday and we have a special schedule that day. Mass in English will be celebrated on Easter at 7:30am, 9:30am and 11:00am. On Easter the Spanish Mass is moved to 12:45pm. 2) there are NO more scheduled Confessions before Easter. There will not be Confessions heard this coming Wednesday and also not on Saturday. In fact, the next regularly scheduled Confessions are on Saturday. April 22.

Have a good and a blessed Holy Week. May the Paschal Mystery touch your hearts and your lives and fill you with the wonder and awe of the saving death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Remember, above all, to Keep the Faith!
