Just now, as I was ready to go about addressing the things on my To Do List for today, once again, Laura reminded me that my bulletin column was due in an hour. Last week, since I was on retreat, my bulletin column got forgotten.

On my mind right now, is how pleased I am at the turn out of parishioners who joined us for our Advent Penance Service last night. So many of you came to prepare your hearts for the coming of our Savior bv receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We know it as Confession because we confess (or tell) our sins to the priest (under the seal of Confession); we also know it as Penance since a penance is assigned to us as our way of participating in the penance of Christ Jesus, our Lord for the forgiveness of our sins; and finally, we call it Reconciliation since, through this great sacrament, we are reconciled (or made one/at peace) with God.

About a week or so ago, Deacon Ed had mentioned that, in past years the Blessed Sacrament was exposed for the Penance Service. I thought that this was a good idea, especially since we are in the midst of the National Eucharistic Revival inaugurated by our bishops. And so, I planned a Penance Service that would begin with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, include prayers, Scriptural readings, an Examination of Conscience and Act of Contrition and then be followed by individual confessions while the Blessed Sacrament remained exposed so that individuals could pray and do their penances in the presence of our Eucharistic Jesus.

Prior to the Penance Service, which began at 7:00pm, those priests who came to assist by hearing confessions gathered in the rectory where some parishioners volunteered their time, resources and giftedness to provide a delicious dinner for the priests. Just as we were finishing dessert and preparing to come over to the church, one of the priests, who had been here last year, mentioned that the Blessed Sacrament was exposed without ceremony, there was no Penance Service and the priests just heard confessions. At the end, the Blessed Sacrament was reposed (placed back into the tabernacle) without ceremony and that the whole thing took an hour. It now made sense to me why Laura wrote in the announcements that the Penance Service was from 7:00-8:00pm. I kept wondering: "How could she know how long it would take?"

Well, walking over to the church, I realized that this was going to take longer than an hour. In the end, I found that it really didn't take that much longer after all. When I finished hearing confessions and went back out into the church for Benediction, my watch read: 8:17pm. I thought to myself, only a quarter of an hour or so longer.

What I especially liked about the Service, apart from the fact that so many turned out to be reconciled with God, is that, all of my brother priests knelt down before the altar with me for Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. I believe that it is encouraging and inspiring for the Catholic Faithful to see a priest at prayer, especially to see his devotion to our Lord in the Eucharist.

Indeed, it is through our Eucharistic Lord, who is present in such a manner that He offers His very life for our reconciliation with God, that the power of absolution in the Sacrament of Reconciliation flows!

May God continue to bless all of you and your families as we prepare to celebrate the coming of Christ Jesus our Savior!
