
FIRST HOLY COMMUNION



FROM THE PASTOR



Another month has come and gone and it's so hard to keep track! I fear that when 2020 is looked back on it will seem like a "lost year" for many of us.

This coming week we celebrate the **Feast of the Transfiguration** of the Lord on <u>August 6</u>. This

commemorates the moment when, on Mount Tabor, Jesus was transfigured before Peter, James & John and His true glory appeared. They saw Him as He really is, in the splendor of holiness and the radiance of His divinity. It was only for a moment but it was real.

Jesus did this so they would remember when they saw His cruel Passion and death that it was a man who was also truly God who was suffering and dying for them. So, He wanted them to see His glory as God in order for them to later make the connection that He also revealed Himself as God while He was sacrificing Himself on the cross. This they would be able to bear witness to later on. The Transfiguration contextualizes the Crucifixion.

The point about seeing Jesus as He truly is becomes the central point. I fear that all too often we do not see Jesus as He truly is. Rather, we project our own ideas and feelings onto Jesus. We recreate God in our own image rather than the other way around.

Here's a simple way to find out if that happens with you. If you are ever in a discussion or even an argument with someone and you catch yourself beginning a sentence by saying, "Well, I don't think that Jesus would care very much about..." -OR- if you find yourself saying, "I don't think God cares one way or the other about that" -OR- "Well, that's not *MY* God!" then you might have a problem.

Each of those is a pretty good indicator that you've got your own preconceived notion of who God is and how He's supposed to act and it usually coincides precisely with your thoughts and ideas. How 'bout that?!

The task before us, like Peter, James & John, is to see the Lord as He truly is not as we would have Him be. That may be difficult and challenging at times. God may turn out to be more tolerant of others' faults, more caring, more forgiving, more loving, more understanding than we might wish to be at any given moment. Yet, to follow Him we must become like Him.

Have a week ahead filled with blessings and peace.
