RELIGIOUS EDUCATION UPDATES

In light of the Covid crisis and a great deal of uncertainty about the resumption of school we have made the following decision about Religious Education Classes for the 2020-2021 academic year:

We will be offering remote learning in the Fall from October until December and in-person classes will not begin until January of 2021.

This was not an easy decision but given the amount of uncertainty and anxiety about having students return to classes we wanted to try and take some pressure off of families by allowing them to do their Religious Ed. from home and postpone returning in person until, hopefully, the situation with the pandemic improves.

The online licensing and other materials necessary to proceed with the Religious Education program still has costs incurred for the Parish so the usual Religious Education fees remain in effect. To do even online learning we have to pay for the materials. Just because it is online doesn't mean it's free.

While the registration deadline has already passed we are establishing a new deadline for those who have not yet registered a child. All children must be registered and all fees must be paid by SEPTEMBER 6. Failure to register AND to be fully paid up will result in your child having to skip this year entirely and continue in the Fall of next year at their same grade level.

While online remote learning will be offered until the end of December you may not "opt out" of the Fall and still have your child attend in-person classes in January. Registration is for the entire school year.

Attendance at either the online live-streamed Mass on Facebook -OR- attendance at one of the two Sunday Masses in person will be required until churches have fully opened up again. Grades 7 & 8 will still be required to write a summary of the weekly homily and keep an up-to-date notebook throughout the entire school year.

Further details about the procedure for logging on to the online program and emailing assignments to Catechists will be forthcoming from our Director of Religious Education, Mrs. Joyce Rock. Any and all questions should be directed to Mrs. Rock in the Religious Education Office at 908-689-0093.

We hope that working remotely for the time being and putting off in-person classes until the situation with the pandemic stabilizes will assist families with continuing their children's religious formation while at the same time helping them to stay safe and healthy.



FROM THE PASTOR



It was good to go away to break up the routine but, as always, it is even better to be back home.

We hear about the necessity to take up our own cross and follow Jesus. This is a good thing for us to apply to the present situation due to the Covid crisis. A lot is

being asked of us. There are many sacrifices to make. Some have to endure hardships. Others have had to endure physical suffering and illness.

In each of these instances we have our own small share in suffering; in the cross. It might be helpful to see those moments as an opportunity to unite our own suffering to the suffering of Christ in order to feel closer to Him.
