FROM THE PASTOR



On this "Gaudete Sunday" we are reminded that the penitential season of Advent still has a character of joy! Penance does not equal sadness or misery. Penance prompts us to humility and reconciliation and we receive God's love and mercy...two things to be very joyful about.

The rose color of today's liturgy lightens the penitential purple by a shade and serves to act as a reminder that we all need to "lighten up" even as the world around us seems a very dark place. **WE** can be the light shining in the darkness; we can be the joy brought to someone who is feeling down. We find our joy in the knowledge that Christ has come and is coming again!

It's also wonderful to know that on this 150th anniversary of St. Joseph being declared the patron saint of the Universal Church in 1870 Pope Francis has decreed that the 12 months between December 8, 2020 and December 8, 2021 would be observed as a special "Year of St. Joseph". This also has a happy coincidence for us as 2021 is the sesquicentennial, or 150th anniversary, of the establishment of our parish by Bishop James Roosevelt Bayley of Newark (the nephew of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton) in 1871. Our parish was established in 1871, the first Mass here was in 1871 and the original church property was purchased in 1872.

It's almost as if the Church all over the world will be observing a special year in honor of our anniversary! As of right now we have been unable to plan any special events for our sesquicentennial because of pandemic restrictions but before the year 2021 goes by we will certainly plan something special (probably in the latter part of next year) to mark our special moment and also to fully participate in the Year of St. Joseph.
