This is a great opportunity to come and ask God for His blessings as we begin a New Year.



I want to say a quick word of **thanks** in advance to two groups of people who are putting in some

Those who provide music for us (even in these musically restricted pandemic days) and those who decorate our church for Christmas. I am very grateful for all they do always but, in particular, during these odd and stressful times I want to say "Thank You".

Please remember three things that are coming up in January:

- The Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God on <u>January 1</u> is a day which, because of the pandemic, we are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. There will be one Mass that day at <u>11:00AM</u>.
