MEN'S SPIRITUALITY GROUP


The group will meet on Saturday, December 19 at 7:00AM in the Community Room (please wear a mask).

FROM THE PASTOR



Our season of waiting, watching and preparing continues as we journey through Advent to the nativity of the Lord.

In this second week we are still focusing on the Second Coming of Jesus at the end of time. While last week we were told to be

watchful. This week we are exhorted by no less than St. John the Baptist to be prepared. It's not really an injunction simply to look busy. Rather, we are being reminded that all through our lives we need to <u>be</u> busy doing the work of a disciple and continuing to do our part to spread the Good News and help prepare the way for the Messiah to return.

Advent already is a very busy time of the year, even during a global pandemic! But, the busy-ness of the preparations we all make for the coming holidays is not he 'real' work of a disciple. It can even serve to be a distraction from what is most important. Don't get me wrong. A big celebration like Christmas doesn't just appear out of thin air. There are preparations to be made and things to be done surely.

Nevertheless, it is important that we don't let that distract us from our spiritual preparations and for making a place in our hearts and in our lives for the Lord, Jesus.

If today wasn't the Second Sunday of Advent then it would be the feast of a saint who is very important at this time of the year: St. Nicholas! Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa Claus and he was Greek and the bishop of Myra in Asia Minor (today it is the city of Demre, Turkey). Sometimes, he is called St. Nicholas of Bari (in southern Italy) because a large portion of his relics were moved there and are still there to this day.

One of the earliest attested and most famous incidents from his life is that he is said to have rescued three girls from being forced into prostitution by dropping a sack of gold coins through the window of their house each night for three nights so their father could pay a dowry for each of them. That's how he became associated with bringing gifts!

May St. Nicholas intercede for all of you to help you receive the grace to open your hearts and your minds to the Lord and to prepare a place for Him in your lives not only at the coming Christmas feast, but always.
