#### <u>FYI</u>

To keep you in the loop about some of our extraordinary expenses; the expenses over and above our weekly operating costs, at present extraordinary expenses that require attention include:

- -Repairs and replacement of the lights in the Narthex to LED lights: \$6,075.00
- -Repairs to the masonry of the chimney of the Rectory: \$11,800.00

In addition, at the urging of the Diocese our parish has applied for the second round of Federal PPP loans. It is unknown if that means we will qualify. Our parish did not apply for the first round of loans and has not received any federal money so far.

# **FROM THE PASTOR**



It feels this week like we're all living in the Disney film "Frozen"! I hope and pray that you are doing well and staying safe after this incredible snow we've had this week.

This coming week we celebrate the feast of <u>Our Lady of Lourdes</u>

on February 11. This is also designated each year as the "World Day of Prayer for the Sick". Not only do we recommend all those who are ill or infirm to the intercession of Our Lady who, by her miraculous apparition in the little village of Lourdes in the French Pyrenees, has helped to bring about the cure of many sick people but it is a good day to be mindful not only of all the world's sick but of those people in our households, our neighborhoods and our families who are ill or infirm.

The pandemic makes it hard to reach out to them in person because social distancing and isolation have become of paramount importance for those who are already ill. Nevertheless, you can pray for them, give them a phone call, have a virtual visit online, send them a small present or some flowers or do any little thing to let them know they are remembered and that you are thinking of them and praying for them.

In addition, those who are ill or homebound have one thing that many of us lack: some more time to give over to prayer. So, while it is of paramount importance that we pray for them and serve their other needs you can also ask those who are troubled by illness to pray for you as well. In this, and even in the midst of their illness, they can also find some purpose, some meaning and the ability to stay connected to their loved ones and the rest of the world. Illness often brings with it a sense of isolation - now mores than ever because of the pandemic - so asking for their prayers helps them to feel a sense of connection to others.

I would also mention again that in just two more weeks we will be returning to our full schedule of masses in person each weekend in addition to our daily Masses. Starting the weekend of February 20 & 21, which is the first weekend of Lent, we will have weekend Masses on Saturday at 5:00PM (which will continue to be live-streamed on our Facebook page as well) and on Sunday at 7:30AM, 9:30AM in Spanish and 11:00AM. Capacity for these Masses will be 110 people and the public restrooms remain CLOSED.
