#### THE CRY ROOM

The church was designed to have a Cry Room at the back of the church so that there would be a place for families with crying or unruly children to sit and still be able to see and hear the Mass without a problem. It is, essentially, provided for those with young children and infants to have a place to sit.

Increasingly, it has been noticed that many people are sitting there who do not have children with them.

A reminder that the Cry Room does not exist for those who come to Mass late, or don't like sitting near others, or who want to sit as far back as possible. If you do not have young children or infants with you please be considerate of your fellow parishioners and do not sit in the Cry Room. Please leave those places free for those who need them.
