
Sacrament of Marriage

FROM THE PASTOR



As we continue to feel the effects of the Covid-19 emergency please know that you and your families are being remembered in my prayers and also in the prayers offered at Mass. I know the months of living in unusual circumstances have taken and are taking a toll on people emotionally,

spiritually, financially and in other ways as well. Please try not to lose heart. Don't allow the unusual circumstances and the sacrifices we have to make get you down. Continue to pray and to ask for the Lord's grace and mercy. Continue to place yourselves in God's hands. None of us knows precisely when this will all come to an end but we do know that it will, assuredly, come to an end.

Jesus tells us the parable this week of the seed and the sower. One of the things we gain from that parable is that God (who is "the sower" in that story) is the one who does the majority of the work. God is always sowing seeds. God is always willing to sow seeds in our hearts and lives. He never gives up on us. He never decides to offer His grace and then to withdraw it from us. He is the consistent one.

When there are times in our lives that we sense His absence from us, or there are times when we simply feel like He isn't listening to us that's usually because of our inconsistency.

We are taught, "Jesus Christ: the same yesterday, today and forever". How true this is and how frequently we tend to forget it. Our mission, or goal in life must always be to strive to place our hope and trust in the Lord. He remains faithful. He remains steady and trustworthy. He is always reaching out to us (that's what the "sowing the seeds" means).

I will remind you here even though it appears elsewhere in this Bulletin that our July Food Collection for the Washington Food Pantry will take place on Monday, July 13. Non-Perishable food items may be dropped off in the Narthex of the church from 8:00AM until 6:00PM. You may place them in the shopping cart in the Narthex or, if the cart is full, place them on the floor around the cart. In the past you have all been so kind and generous in these collections of food. So, I will say "Thank You" in advance because I know that you will, once again, be generous to those in need.

I will also add a word of *Thanks* for your kind generosity in helping us to reach, and slightly surpass, our Bishop's Annual Appeal goal. I know these are challenging times for people financially and so I appreciate all the more your generous donations.
