# **OUR CHURCH IS OPEN AGAIN!**

We have moved from Phase I to Phase II of re-opening.

Here at St. Joseph daily Mass at 9:00AM will resume on June 17.

Sunday Mass at 7:30AM and 11:00AM will resume on June 14. There will be no Spanish Mass and no Saturday evening Mass until further notice.

Weekend Mass will be live streamed Saturday at 5:30PM.


The church will be open for private prayer on Saturdays from 12:00 Noon until 5:00PM and also be open for private prayer Monday - Friday from 9:00AM until 6:00PM.

Confessions will be heard regularly on Saturday afternoons from 4:00 - 5:00PM. Father will use the sacristy so that appropriate distance can be maintained while insuring privacy. Those wishing to go to Confession should wear a mask and may wait in the Narthex standing six (6) feet apart until they can go into the Sacristy to confess.

#### **BISHOPS ANNUAL APPEAL**

As of the writing of this bulletin our parish has so far pledged \$26,563.00 and has so far paid \$22,863.00 toward our parish goal of \$24,889.25 These pledges have been received from 118 households.

We have now reached 98.38% of our goal. We really excruciatingly close to being there! We just have \$437.00 to go.

If you have not yet made a pledge <u>PLEASE</u> consider doing so. A pledge of just \$25.00 or \$50.00 would go such a long way to helping us reach our goal!

#### FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Because of all the restrictions imposed by the government shut-down and because we had no way of anticipating when that might end it became necessary to postpone the date for our parish First Holy Communion until the Fall. No date has yet been set but we are looking at September. Originally planned for May, it was postponed until June and finally we decided to move it to the Fall. There were too many families requesting we have it when it could be a more normal celebration with few restrictions. We regret the inconvenience but there was no other way.

# FROM THE PASTOR



Oh Sacrament Most Holy! Oh Sacrament Divine! All praise and all thanksgiving be every moment Thine!

It is exciting and good to be able to have Mass again this weekend with a congregation. For the time being we will have Mass on

Sundays at 7:30AM & 11:00AM. In addition, there will be a Mass live-streamed on Facebook every Saturday evening at 5:30PM.

Daily Mass at 9:00AM will resume on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>June 17</u>. In addition starting on <u>Monday</u>, <u>June 15</u> the Parish Office will be open again Monday - Friday for a half day from 9:00AM until 1:00PM.

A word of **THANKS** to all of you who so generously gave to the food collection for the Washington Food Bank last Monday.

With regard to Sunday Masses no more than <u>50</u> people will be allowed to attend Mass. This will be done on a first come/first served basis. If and when the 50tth person shows up no one else will be allowed in.

Holy Communion will be distributed and the <u>END</u> of Mass, after the final blessing, so that that people may receive Communion and leave immediately. This will avoid any bottlenecks in the doorways or gathering in the Narthex.

Everyone attending Mass should please wear a mask, sit only in the areas not blocked off to maintain proper distance and, if you have it, please bring your own hand sanitizer to use while entering church and immediately before receiving Holy Communion.

If anyone is sick in any way, or even feels slightly sick you should not come to Mass! If anyone is elderly or has any pre-existing conditions, or is in any way immunity compromised you should not come to Mass! People with very small children should probably refrain from coming to Mass at this time and wait until restrictions are lifted further.

I am thankful that after such a long wait many will be able to receive Holy Communion on the feast of the Body & Blood of Christ. I know what a sacrifice it has been to go without it. I remain hopeful that we will steadily continue the reopening phases and soon have parish life back to its usual pace.
