OUR CHURCH IS OPEN AGAIN!

We have moved from Phase I to Phase II of re-opening.

Here at St. Joseph daily Mass has resumed at 9:00AM.

Sunday Mass at 7:30AM and 11:00AM. There will be no Spanish Mass and no Saturday evening Mass until further notice.

Weekend Mass will be live streamed Saturday at 5:30PM.

The church will be open for private prayer on Saturdays from 12:00 Noon until 5:00PM and also be open for private prayer Monday - Friday from 9:00AM until 6:00PM.

Confessions will be heard regularly on Saturday afternoons from 4:00 - 5:00PM. Father will use the sacristy so that appropriate distance can be maintained while insuring privacy. Those wishing to go to Confession should wear a mask and may wait in the Narthex standing six (6) feet apart until they can go into the Sacristy to confess.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Because of all the restrictions imposed by the government shut-down and because we had no way of anticipating when that might end it became necessary to postpone the date for our parish First Holy Communion until the Fall. No date has yet been set but we are looking at September. Originally planned for May, it was postponed until June and finally we decided to move it to the Fall. There were too many families requesting we have it when it could be a more normal celebration with few restrictions. We regret the inconvenience but there was no other way.

FROM THE PASTOR



Once again, more restrictions have been modified here in New Jersey. We may now have as many as <u>100 people at our</u> weekend <u>Masses</u> and the Governor is no longer placing restrictions on other religious gatherings. So, things have taken another step towards

normal. That's good news. However, we still need to be vigilant.

Masks must still be worn by all those coming to Mass. We will continue to give out Holy Communion at the end of Mass. We are all asked to continue to maintain distance between each other. In particular, I must ask you to be more aware of this when coming up to receive Communion. Please leave space between yourself and the person in front of you. For the time being the bathrooms in the church will remain completely closed. However, that will certainly be the next thing to change. I hope to have them accessible again in the near future.

As the restrictions are now being loosened this is not a time to become complacent. In fact, it is a time to be ever more aware of those things that can help prevent the spread of disease.
