The current instructions from the Bishop are to maintain this until April 4 <u>HOWEVER</u> this is subject to change. As things change we will update you.

For the time being any funerals may have no more than 25 people in attendance. Any scheduled weddings may go ahead with no more than 25 people present in church. All Baptisms will be postponed until after this ban is lifted unless there is an emergency.

Masses are still being said privately every day so all the requested Mass intentions are being fulfilled. It is possible to have Anointing of the Sick and Communion brought to the sick and homebound. Please contact the Parish Office for Anointing or Communion for the sick and homebound.

Some have asked about our scheduled celebration of First Holy Communion on May 2. At present we simply <u>do not know</u> if this will go ahead as scheduled. As that becomes more clear we will update you as soon as possible.

FROM THE PASTOR



Well, here is a bulletin column I never would have imagined I would have to write. These are certainly strange times in which we are living, to be sure. But, with the strange-ness also comes fear and anxiety. Our Lord reminds us, "Who among you, by worrying, can add a moment to your life?" (Matt 6:27) and elsewhere he said to Jairus, "Fear

is useless; what is needed is faith." (Like 8:50)

In these troubling times we must work to strengthen our faith in God, in each other and in the ability of men and women who are working hard to find solutions to the problem at hand.

In the mean time, even though it is a hardship, we must make some sacrifices. Of course, one of the big sacrifices we must make is to stay away from gathering at our church for Mass, Confessions, devotions, liturgies, activities or meetings of any kind. This would be a problem at any time but because it has come during Lent and in the days leading up to Easter it seems even worse.

However, this is being done to protect people from the spread of disease, especially the most vulnerable among us. Last January when I suspended Communion under both species for cold & flu season some people weren't happy and a few even laughed at me. Well, no one is laughing now. That was just the tip of the iceberg.

But, the Church is not the church. What I mean is: the Church (i.e. the People of God and Mystical Body of Christ) is not the church (a building). We remain united as a community of faith even when we can't be physically together because we are united in prayer. Many people have lost touch with the idea of making a "Spiritual Communion" even when they can't make a physical one. This is important. Remember that God is always with you even when you can't be physically united to Him.

These strict measures are not unprecedented. During the 1918 flu epidemic churches all over America were closed for weeks. Once again, we are being asked to endure this but we should try to see it as an opportunity to make a real sacrifice for Lent and to offer up this small and temporary suffering for all those suffering much more and whose lives may be at risk.

As more news unfolds regarding Holy Week and Easter I will keep you informed as best I can. In the mean time, practice social-distancing; employ good hygiene; pray more and unite yourself to God and to each other in prayer. Stay safe and be assured I am praying for you all.
