HOLY WEEK AND EASTER

The Bishop has directed the suspension of all public Masses and devotions to extend through Holy Week and Easter as well. Please be aware of the following:

<u>PALM SUNDAY:</u> while the palms will be blessed we have been asked NOT to distribute them on Palm Sunday. They will be made available for those who want them at a later date.

HOLY THURSDAY: there will be no public Mass or devotions.

<u>GOOD FRIDAY:</u> There will be no public Liturgy of the Passion - OR- Stations of the Cross.

HOLY SATURDAY: there will be no blessing of Easter food and no Great Vigil of Easter. The Paschal Candle will be blessed and lit privately.

EASTER SUNDAY: At present we hope to live stream Mass at 11:00AM on Easter Sunday morning.

The church building will be closed all through Holy Week and even on Easter Sunday because no one is allowed in the building while we are live streaming the Mass.

GERTRUDE HAWK CANDY SALE

Because it is not possible for us to have a safe way to distribute the candy purchased from Gertrude Hawk and remain in compliance with the directives from the Governor of New Jersey the distribution of the candy will take place at a later date.

We know this is a great disappointment for the 37 families who ordered candy this year. The candy that you ordered will be delivered and you will receive what you purchased. However, similar to the situation with the blessed palms the candy you ordered will have to be distributed at a later date.

We have arranged with the people at Gertrude Hawk to have the candy delivered after the isolation and social distancing restrictions have been lifted. We know this is definitely a big inconvenience and we apologize but the circumstances are genuinely unusual.

ABSTAINING FROM MEAT ON FRIDAYS

Because it might be difficult to obtain certain kinds of food and being aware of the unusual circumstances and restrictions under which we are all living for the time being the Most Rev. James Checchio, Bishop of Metuchen has dispensed all the faithful of the Diocese of Metuchen from the obligation to abstain from eating meat on <u>FRIDAY, APRIL 3</u>.

PLEASE NOTE: On <u>Good Friday</u>, April 10 **you still have an obligation to abstain from eating meat**. This is a universal law of the Church and the bishop does not have the authority to dispense the faithful for that day.

FROM THE PASTOR



Very sadly I have to report to you that because the global pandemic is not yet under control the restrictions under which we have been living will continue for the time being.

This means that the Bishop has directed us to continue the suspension of public

Masses, devotions and parish activities through Holy Week and Easter as well. For the first time in our lifetimes there will be no possibility to gather together in person to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection as a community. I know this is very disappointing news for everyone.

I plan to live stream Mass on <u>Easter Sunday morning at 11:00AM</u>. It will be an unusual Mass to be sure. It won't be the kind of grand celebration we usually have here at St. Joseph. It will just be me at the altar. But, that is also an opportunity for us as well.

Make no mistake: seeing Mass live streamed online or televised is not "just as good" as going to Mass. When we see the Mass over some remote medium we are not actually participating in Mass. To do that you have to be physically present in the room where Mass is taking place. However, seeing the Mass on TV or live streamed is a decent enough substitute especially when the circumstances preventing you from going to Mass are beyond your control.

It will still be good to pray "together" each from our own homes. It will be good to hear the Word of God proclaimed to us, especially on Easter when the message is about the Lord's Resurrection. It will be good to see the celebration of the Eucharist even though you will have to make a spiritual Communion instead.

It is a pale substitute but it is better than nothing. We will still be united as a community of faith through our common prayer even when we cannot be truly united in the same place. Yes, coming together is important because the Mass is not an entertainment or something for spectators. At Mass we are all participating and entering into the Mystery of Christ's passion, death and resurrection.

However, because we cannot control the circumstances in which we find ourselves this coming Holy Week and Easter will be challenging and leave us wanting more. Nevertheless, the Mysteries being celebrated will still be real and true and, maybe, being deprived of full participation, we will come to appreciate them all the more in our lives.

Stay healthy and safe and may God bless you all in these anxious and unusual days.
