FROM THE PASTOR



Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Surrexit Christus! Alleluia! ¡Cristo ha Resucitado! Aleluya!

I hope and pray that all of you and your families are safe and continuing to cope with the quarantine and lock down conditions. It is a very trying time

and I know a lot of people are anxious and feeling very stressed out. At the risk of sounding facetious, have you tried praying more? It is proven that prayer is a great stress reliever. In these days when so many people have some more time on their hands try setting aside some of it to spend in prayer. You may discover that it calms you and helps you to feel a little less stress.

Elsewhere in this bulletin take note about the Gertrude Hawk Candy and the Washington Food Pantry. We will look to organizing another food collection in June.

Since the Governor of New Jersey has extended the shut down conditions until at least June 6 it calls into question when we will be getting back into church for regular public Masses. At this point I simply don't know except to say that if the shut down is continuing into June then I don't see how we will be back in church this month at all. Clearly, we are now looking to June as a target. I, personally, hope we can have public Mass again on Corpus Christi (June 14) but right now nothing is certain and I wouldn't be surprised if it might be later than that.

I also realize that is not what you want to hear and it is both disappointing and upsetting. It is for me as well. But, every time I am tempted to allow my frustration to get the better of me I realize that these measures are in place for our safety and the safety of others. We are doing all this to protect people. I acknowledge that what is being asked of us is a great deal. people of my generation didn't grow up in a time when great sacrifices were called for like the generation before me who lived through things like the Great Depression and World War II.

Now, in this time, we are living through something that historians in the future will look back on as a truly extraordinary time. The great pandemic of 2020 will be taught about in schools and people will look back and see that it was a difficult time but one that was endured for the sake of others.

In that, it is not entirely unlike the life and mission of Jesus in the world. He endured a great deal and found the grace and strength to do it because He did it for the sake of others. He suffered much but the story ends with glorious resurrection. So will ours. Keep believing that.
