FROM THE PASTOR



Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Surrexit Christus! Alleluia! ¡Cristo ha resucitado! Alleluia!

This Sunday we keep the (*transferred*) <u>Solemnity of the</u> <u>Ascension of the Lord</u>. It was transferred from Thursday to Sunday by the Bishops of NJ for

this year **only**. We celebrate the completion of the Paschal Mystery when Christ ascended again to the Father from Whom He came. This is a feast that very much marks a "passing of the torch" moment; from Jesus doing the work of salvation to us, the Church.

Next week we celebrate the birth of the Church at Pentecost when the Holy Spirit came down upon the Disciples-turned-Apostles. I was hoping we would have been back in church for Mass by Pentecost but we know now that isn't going to be possible. Public Masses will remain suspended for the time being.

Many people have made inquiries about how, if at all, it would be possible to receive Holy Communion during these days of social distance lock down. There might be a solution but it is **FAR** from an ideal one. It has been suggested that it might be possible to for people to see the Mass live-streamed in their homes and then afterwards make their way over to church and receive Holy Communion while remaining in their cars.

To me that sounds a little bit too much like the drive-thru window at McDonalds! But, it would provide people who have been deprived of physically receiving Communion for some nine weeks to do so (under strict conditions and guidelines) which could be a great comfort to them and a great benefit spiritually.

The Bishop has issued instructions on how we might do this and I am carefully considering it. Please recall that I have two pre-existing conditions (asthma and diabetes) that make me especially vulnerable to the virus and I want to avoid infection if I can. However, I am sympathetic to the needs of people who want to receive Holy Communion.

I am considering doing this on Pentecost Sunday as a way to celebrate extra specially that important feast of the Church which concludes the Easter season. It would be something we do <u>ONCE</u> and not something we would do every week. There are a number of rules people will have to follow in order to participate. The idea is that people could receive on this occasion to "tide them over" until we are able to return to public Masses. I will announce this week what I have decided to do via the website and Facebook page.

Please continue to pray for each other, for the rest of the world, and please pray for me too. You are all remembered in my prayers, especially at Mass.
