ARE WE OPENING UP CHURCH AGAIN???

The Governor's Executive Order 107 (the shut down) **remains in effect.** Under these provisions gatherings more than ten (10) people are <u>not</u> permitted.

Here at St. Joseph f<u>or the time being we will continue</u> to live-stream Sunday Mass and celebrate daily Mass privately. We do not plan to have "drive-in Mass -ORoffer "drive-thru" Communion at present.

The church will be unlocked and open for private prayer on Saturdays from 12:00 Noon until 5:00PM and on Sundays for private prayer from 9:00AM until 10:30AM (it has to be closed while we live-stream the 11:00AM Mass).The church will also be open for private prayer Monday - Friday from 9:00AM until 6:00PM.

In addition, <u>CONFESSIONS</u> will be heard regularly on <u>Saturday afternoons from 4:00 - 5:00PM</u>. Father will use the sacristy so that appropriate distance can be maintained while insuring privacy. Those wishing to go to Confession should wear a mask and may wait in the Narthex standing six (6) feet apart until they can go into the Sacristy to confess.

FROM THE PASTOR



Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Surrexit Christus! Alleluia! ¡Cristo ha resucitado! Aleluia!

For all of this we can and should pray for the strength, the comfort and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. He was present at the creation of all things; He inspired the earliest Christians to build a community of faith and love and take it on the road to the whole world; He comes to dwell within each of us and constantly renews of life and our love of God.

So...Happy Birthday, Church! Let's all have a Blessed Week ahead. Stay calm; stay safe and keep the faith!
