

FROM THE PASTOR



Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Surrexit Christus! Alleluia! ¡Cristo ha Resucitado! ¡Aleluya!

This Sunday in Paschal Time is usually referred to as "Good Shepherd" Sunday because of the passage from John's gospel we hear about Jesus being the

sheep gate and the true "entrance" to eternal life.

We have also begun the month of May which is, by ancient tradition, considered to be Mary's month. The Church spends this month encouraging special devotion to Our Lady. In our parish we pray the "Memorare" at each Mass at the end of the Universal Prayers.

This year, in addition, the Bishops' Conference of Canada and United States Bishops' Conference decided to have a moment on May 1 when the whole of the United States and Canada was consecrated again to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Of course, we in our diocese have just come through a long process where we consecrated our diocese to Our Lady of Guadalupe. It's just sort of a coincidence that we are now also consecrating our whole country to Mary. To consecrate oneself, a group of people or a whole region to Mary means an act by which a person is dedicated to a sacred service, or an act which separates an object, location or region from a common and profane mode to one for sacred use. The Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments clarifies that in this context the term "consecration" is used in a broad and nontechnical sense: the expression is use of 'consecrating people to Our Lady', by which is intended placing them under her protection and asking her maternal blessing for them. In Catholic teachings, consecration to Mary does not diminish or substitute the love of God, but enhances it, for all consecration is ultimately made to God.

In these days of pandemic and restrictions it is a good spiritual practice to consecrate ourselves again to devotion to Our Lady and to follow her maternal example and seek her intercession. She comforts us and cares for us like a mother and she always leads everyone back to Jesus, her Son.

I continue to offer my prayers for all of you in what I know are difficult times for many of you. I, like so many other people, hope and pray the need for the restrictions will soon come to an end. Try not to lose heart. As I keep saying: Stay Calm; Stay Safe and Healthy; Keep the Faith.

Please remember me in your prayers. So far I am fine and healthy. Have a Blessed Week ahead. I look forward to the day when I will see you all again in person.
