# FROM THE PASTOR



We received some very sad news this week from our Vicar General who wrote to all the priests to inform us of the death of our brother priest, Fr. Ed Flanagan. Please remember Fr. Ed in your prayers and pray for the the repose of his soul. Father Flanagan was ordained on May

28, 1988. His first assignment was as Parochial Vicar at Immaculate Conception Church in Somerville. He served as Parochial Vicar at St. James, Woodbridge, Sacred Heart, South Plainfield, Immaculate Conception, Spotswood, Queenship of Mary, Plainsboro and St. Bernadette, Parlin. He was administrator and then pastor at Nativity of Our Lord Church, Monroe Township from June 2002 until his passing on November 8, 2020 aged only 58.

He will be greatly missed.

Keep praying, too, for our country as we continue in the aftermath of the Presidential Election. Pray that peace and unity will prevail in our nation.

This past week the Holy See issued the long awaited report on the situation with the former cardinal Theodore McCarrick who also served as the founding bishop of our diocese. The 449 page report is difficult to read (there is a link to it as well as a letter from our bishop on the parish Facebook page) but a necessary reporting of the findings of the investigation into that tragic and horrible affair. I hope that it is another step forward as the Church tries to become more transparent about the misdeeds of some of its clergy and that it is a step in the right direction of trying to prevent such occurrences again in the future. It is difficult but necessary that we bring these things to light if there is ever to be any healing.

I am happy to conclude on a happier piece of news by telling you that Mr. James McAloon and Mr. John Rolak have consented to serve as Trustees of the parish for the coming term of two years. Both men are long-time parishioners and, I think, well known to most of you. They have both been active parishioners serving in different capacities throughout the years. They are succeeding the two former Trustees, Mrs. Mary Jane Lusardi who has concluded her service after being a Trustee for several years and the late Mrs. Patty Sue Rolak who, sadly, was taken from us far too soon when she passed away last April after a battle with cancer. We are most grateful to Mary Jane and we continue to pray for the repose of Patty Sue
