# FROM THE PASTOR



For all the Saints, who from their labors rest! Who, Thee, by faith, before the world confessed Your Name, O Jesus! A very happy and blessed Solemnity of All Saints to you. We begin a whole month of praying for the dead and of reflecting on the four last things: Death, Judgement,

Heaven & Hell. That may sound ominous to many but we begin this month of the dead on a joyous and triumphant note with All Saints Day. We recall those holy men and women (the word "saint" means "holy") who have gone before us in death and who we believe already enjoy the beatific vision in heaven.

This isn't because they were born to be that way. They aren't some privileged class. These were regular men and women who lived some aspect (not necessarily every single aspect) of their faith to a heroic degree and are held up to the faithful as worthy of veneration. So, we venerate their holiness as a way of reminding us that we are all called to that kind of holiness. We are all called to be saints.

On Monday, All Souls' Day, we will recall all the other faithful departed who have also gone before us but that usually has a sadder and more sombre quality to it because we miss them. Then, we spend the whole month, which is the final month of the Church year, thinking about and praying for the dead. But, today - All Saints Day - we recall those who have, by faith and perseverance, triumphed over the power of darkness and serve as examples to us of what we all can be: holy.

On a personal note: my mother, Patricia, was born on November 1, 1930 so this All Saints Day she is celebrating her 90th birthday at her home in California. Because of the pandemic I am not able to travel to be with her. Please, in your kindness, spare a prayer for her.

Finally, a word about what's coming on <u>Tuesday</u>, **Election Day**. It is not my place to tell you how to vote. Each man and woman has the right to vote as they see fit. I can only encourage you, if you have not already voted, to take part in the electoral process and vote. I hope and pray people keep the teachings of our Church in mind as they make their choice. Voting is not only our civic duty but it can also be seen as a moral and ethical responsibility. So, if you have already voted (like me) then great. If you have not yet done so, please vote!
