Sacrament of Marriage


Couples planning marriage are requested to make an appointment with the Pastor. Arrangements should be made one year in advance.

As I write this on Friday morning we are all still waiting for a result in the Presidential election. It can be anxiety building and frustrating but the combination of huge amounts of mail-in voting and a very close race in several places means that we have to do something we don't normally

have to do. Namely, we have to wait and count each and every vote. That takes time. But, a lot is at stake. If you are concerned about the outcome I fully understand. If you're just annoyed because you think we should be able to declare a winner in one day then I would ask you to consider that you may just be giving in to our modern, American desire for instant gratification. We all need to be patient and get this right.

In the mean time, while we are watching and waiting and hoping and praying there are **LOTS** of other things to be concerned about. There is still a global pandemic going on and showing no signs of stopping. We still have troops overseas in harm's way and they have families here at home worried about them. There are lots of people in the world affected by hunger, poverty, violence, illness, etc. and they are in need of our help and prayers.

Here in the parish we are trying to somehow carry on in the midst of pandemic lockdowns but we are dealing with reduced ministries and activities, dwindling weekly collections, an inability to plan accordingly not knowing what's going to happen and we still have an entire roof on the classroom building that is going to need replacing.
