Daylight Saving Time ends on <u>October 31, 2020</u> in the middle of the night. When you go to bed on October 31 remember to set your clocks back one hour and enjoy an extra hour of sleep.

ALL SAINTS' DAY is <u>November 1</u> which, this year, falls on a Sunday. All of the Sunday Masses on November 1 will celebrate All Saints' Day.

ALL SOULS' DAY or the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed is <u>November 2</u>. On that day we will have one Mass at 7:00PM to pray for all the dead and, in particular, for those from our parish who died during the past year. **Please Note:** there will be no 9:00AM Mass on Monday, November 2. The evening Mass will be the only Mass that day.

Just looking ahead a little bit in the calendar remember that Daylight Saving Time ends in the middle of the night in between Hallowe'en and All Saints' Day. So when you go to bed on <u>October 31</u> remember to turn your clocks **BACK** one hour. I always love this one because we

get an extra hour of sleep, and who doesn't love that? Of course the flip side is that it will indeed be getting dark even earlier in the day.

Speaking of **All Saints' Day** (<u>November 1</u>) this year it falls on a Sunday.
