## Sacrament of Marriage


Couples planning marriage are requested to make an appointment with the Pastor. Arrangements should be made one year in advance.

## **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!**

There are numerous opportunities to volunteer here at our parish. We need lots of help!

- 1. We need Volunteers to clean the Mens' Room and the Ladies' Room after every Mass beginning the <u>first weekend of October</u>. In order to re-open the bathrooms they must be lightly cleaned after every Mass. This includes wiping down door handles, faucets and counter tops. Two volunteers are needed after each Mass (so, that's six volunteers per Sunday every Sunday). Please call the Rectory Office.
- 2. We are in need of BINGO workers! We haven't had BINGO in our parish since March. This is our principal fundraising effort and it has cost us approximately, \$4,000.00 per month in added income to the parish. We are hoping to start at least having one BINGO per month on the first weekend of each month as soon as we can (but probably not until 2021). If we get enough volunteers we might be able to do two per month. There will be NO FOOD CONCESSION at all because of current restrictions but we need other workers to have BINGO! Please contact the Rectory Office if you can help.
- 3. We are in need of people to come and clean the church. This activity has previously been taken care of by **one famil**y in the parish. But, we need some help. This involves cleaning the restrooms, vacuuming the church and narthex, dusting especially the light fixtures, statues, and corners. It would be nice if at least once a month we had a group of Volunteers to keep the church clean. Many hands make for light work. Contact the Rectory Office if you can help.
- 4. There is an **extreme** need for volunteers at the Washington Food Pantry. The work is light and involves handing out prepared bags of food at the Presbyterian Church in Washington on <u>Tuesdays from 9:00 11:00AM</u>. Autumn will soon be upon us! I love being able to say that every year. Autumn is my absolute favorite time of the year. It includes so many holidays that I'm fond of, including my favorite—Thanksgiving. It also has the weather that I am fondest of where it starts out being cool,

then turns chilly and ends up being really quite cold. But, usually, the really horrible weather including snow holds off until Winter.

Autumn is a time of turning leaves, vibrant colors and waning daylight hours. I always like to see it not as a time when things are dying.
