FROM THE PASTOR



Happy Feast! <u>August 22</u>, the octave day of the Assumption is the Feast of the Queenship of Mary.

The Catholic teaching on this subject is expressed in the papal encyclical <u>Ad</u>

<u>Caeli Reginam</u>, issued by Pope Pius XII in 1954. Queen of Heaven (*Regina Caeli*) is one of many Queen titles used for Our Lady. The title derived in part from the ancient Catholic teaching that Mary, at the end of her earthly life, was bodily and spiritually assumed into heaven, and that she is there honored as Queen.

Pius XII's encyclical asserts that Mary deserves the title because she is Mother of God, because she is closely associated as the New Eve with Jesus' redemptive work, because of her preeminent perfection and because of her intercessory power. He also states that the main principle on which the royal dignity of Mary rests is her Divine Motherhood. ... So with complete justice St. John Damascene could write: "When she became Mother of the Creator, she truly became Queen of every creature."

After the establishment of the diocese of Metuchen forty years ago in 1981 St. John Paul II declared Mary, Our Queen to be the patroness of the new diocese. That's why our diocesan coat of arms contains the letter "M" with a crown, to represent Mary, Our Queen.
