FROM THE PASTOR



As we reach the Second Sunday of Advent we hear from one of the central figures of this season: St. John the Baptist. A cousin of the Lord and the last and greatest of the prophets Jesus Himself said that there was not a man

born of woman who was greater than John the Baptist.

He concludes a long line of prophets who foretold the coming of the Messiah and it fell to John to identify the Messiah when He came. John did so in dramatic fashion exclaiming, "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" using words that we repeat every time we celebrate Mass.

His exhortation to make straight the path for God and to fill every valley and level every mountain is an instruction to us to see to it that we remove all the obstacles between us and the Lord who is going to return. At this point in the Advent season we are still focused on the Second Coming of Christ. After all, it makes sense. We can't go back in time to prepare the way of the Lord for His First Coming. In addition, we aren't merely engaging in a game of re-living the past by remembering what had been said to people who lived thousands of years ago as though it is some kind of historical curiosity.

Rather, this message, spoken by St. John 2,000 years ago is also for us now: Prepare the way for the Lord in your own lives in your own time and in your own place! Christ is coming and He will judge the living and the dead. The absolute fullness of the glory of God's kingdom will explode upon the world even as this world ends and a new world begins.

We must use this life of ours, a precious gift given to us by God, our Father, to live in a manner worthy of being a citizen of His kingdom. We must chip away at the mountain of sin that blocks our path. We must also fill in the valleys of disobedience and indifference with the virtues that help us to fulfill our calling as sons and daughters of God.

As we await the coming feast we also await the return of the Messiah who was born to us once, long ago, and who promised He would come back. The Church He founded serves as a mother and teacher to us so that we need not cower in fearfulness or fall into despair because of sin but instead live, and wait...in *HOPE*.

My prayer for you is that you are using these busy Advent days wisely to make a good preparation to celebrate the Lord's birth and also to be prepared for His return.
