RESUMPTION OF MASSES

Starting <u>NEXT WEEK</u> on the First Sunday of Lent we resume our full schedule of Masses:

Saturday Evening at 5:00PM (this Mass is also livestreamed on our Facebook page)

Sunday Morning at 7:30AM, 9:30AM IN SPANISH and 11:00AM

Daily Mass Monday-Friday 9:00AM

Confessions Saturdays from 4:00-4:45PM

Church open daily for private prayer.

NOTE: There will be a maximum of 110 people allowed at each Mass and the bathrooms in church remain CLOSED.

OBLIGATIONS FOR LENT

So that the Church may be spiritually one in a common observance of Lent, the following days of fast and abstinence are to be observed by all Catholics of the Diocese of Metuchen who enjoy the blessings of good health:

- 1. The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. In this parish our patronal day, which is a solemnity, <u>St. Joseph's Day on March 19</u> is a Friday. As Pastor I inform you that you do not have to abstain from meat that day but, if you wish you may either abstain from meat on another day that week -OR- abstain from meat for two out of the three meals you will have that day and have meat at your principal meal. **This applies to Friday, March 19 ONLY!**
- 3. From the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday until the celebration of the Easter Vigil on the evening of Holy Saturday, the Easter fast should be observed so that, with uplifted and welcoming hearts, we may be ready to celebrate the joys of the Resurrection.
- 4. The obligation to fast applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59. To fast in the Catholic Tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal during the day so as to experience hunger.

The obligation of abstinence affects all Catholics who have reached the age of 14 and for the rest of their lives. Abstinence in the Catholic Tradition means to abstain from meat.

The obligation of fast and abstinence, as a whole, is a serious obligation. While failure to observe any one penitential day in itself may not be considered serious, the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of them without good cause, would be considered a grave matter. Those unable to abstain for a valid reason on any given Friday of Lent are asked to perform some other penitential act, or to abstain on another day.

FROM THE PASTOR



Lent begins next week! I am happy to say that, as I had told you, we will resume our full Mass schedule on the <u>First Sunday of Lent</u>. Elsewhere in this bulletin the full schedule is printed for you. I want to emphasize again that because we removed some of the seats in the cry room the new maximum

number of people allowed to be in church for each Mass is now <u>110 people</u> (down from 125). The Knights of Columbus have graciously offered to assist with monitoring the number of people at Mass. One of them will be here to count heads and, if/when we reach our maximum capacity, they will lock the doors. So, starting next week if you arrive at church for Mass and find the door locked that simply means that Mass is full.

I also want to emphasize again that the rest rooms will remain **CLOSED**. So, if you know that you regularly need the rest room at Mass -OR- for families with small children who sometimes need a rest room on short notice, then please keep that in mind when deciding whether or not to come to Mass. You will have no access to a rest room.

I remind you all that Mass will continue to be live-streamed on our parish Facebook page on <u>Saturdays at 5:00PM</u> and remain available throughout the weekend. You do not need to have a Facebook account in order to view the Mass on Facebook.

I will remind you that this year, due to Covid-19, there will be no blessing and distribution of ashes on Ash Wednesday. In addition, Ash Wednesday, February 17, is NOT a holy day of obligation. Receiving ashes is a custom, not a requirement. Also, it is inconsiderate to go to another church that day just because you want ashes. Other parishes are also subject to maximum capacity numbers. Don't go to another church and take up a space that, by right, belongs to a member of that parish.

The guidelines for fasting and abstinence for Lent are printed elsewhere in this bulletin. Please take note that there is a minimum and a maximum age for the practice of fasting. If you are aged 60 or older fasting is optional but not mandatory. However, there is no maximum age for the practice of abstaining from meat on Fridays. That you have to do from age 14 and for the rest of your natural life.

I am greatly looking forward to seeing you at Mass. I know this has been a hardship and a great sacrifice for many of you these past five weeks. I can only say again that the decision was made in the interests of keeping people safe. If it was an overreaction or an error it was an error on the side of caution.

Stay Calm; Stay Safe; Keep the Faith!
