<u>FYI</u>

Just to give you some idea of why we are taking up a special collection for snow removal we'd like to share the following for your information. We have two separate contractors who remove our snow. One takes care of the parking lots and driveways. The other specifically clears the entrances, walkways and sidewalks.

So far we have only received bills from the contractor who plows and salts the parking lots and driveways. <u>This year</u> up to this point we have had to spend \$4,960.00 for <u>snow removal.</u> Keep in mind we have not yet been billed by the other contractor who cleans the sidewalks and walkways!

This gives you some idea of what we are spending to clear away the snow.

FOOD PANTRY COLLECTION

Our monthly collection of food for the Washington Food Pantry will take place the weekend <u>March 6 & 7</u>. Non-Perishable food items may be dropped off in the Church Narthex on Saturday and Sunday only, please.

PLEASE NOTE: The Easter Food Collection will commence the second week of March and food will need to be returned the weekend of March 20 & 21 in time for Easter.

FROM THE PASTOR



When will it end? The snow has been relentless this year. I suppose it is fair to say that the last few winters haven't been so bad and I guess we were due for another harsh one. Please take note of the fact that we have had to pay out a lot for snow removal. The diocese authorized all

parishes to take up a special collection for snow removal. There is a second basket in church so you can separate your regular weekly collection from the special snow removal collection. In addition, there is a separate fund on the Online Giving Page dedicated to the special snow removal collection. So, if you use Online Giving you can separate your regular weekly offering from the special collection for snow removal.

Just to update you on the classroom building roof: we have had an engineering study of the building performed (the cost of which was paid for by a single anonymous donor whose generosity to the parish is greatly appreciated!) in order better to estimate the overall cost of repairing the roof. I'm happy to say the building is structurally sound and will be able to withstand a roof replacement. Our plans to conduct a campaign to raise the funds to cover the cost of replacing the roof has been temporarily sidelined by the Covid-19 pandemic but we still are planning a major fundraising campaign in order to accomplish this.

Now...with the "housekeeping" out of the way I can say a word or two about something spiritual. We have only reached the second Sunday of Lent and there is much more of this grace-filled season ahead of us. If you haven't been living up to your Lenten resolutions so well, don't worry! There is time to get back on track. Remember that God appreciates *each and every* effort we make to get closer to Him whether they are big and successful or small and weak. Everything we do to grow in holiness and to deepen our relationship to God is blessed by Him and appreciated by Him. Your Lent doesn't have to be **perfect**, it merely has to be sincere.

Remember, too, that in addition to things like fasting and abstaining one of the more important aspects of Lent is prayer. Use these days to pray more. That doesn't have to be lengthy. Even just spending *five minutes* more each day in prayer than you might habitually do is a significant thing. So, in addition to doing penance: pray! Speaking of penance, elsewhere in this bulletin please see the expanded opportunities to go to Confession in the parish for Lent. Confession is good for you. You should go!
