To keep you in the loop about some of our extraordinary expenses; the expenses over and above our weekly operating costs, at present extraordinary expenses that require attention include:

- -Repairs and replacement of the lights in the Narthex to LED lights: \$6,075.00
- -Repairs to the masonry of the chimney of the Rectory: \$11,800.00
- -Cost for the engineering study on the Classroom Building roof in order to have an accurate estimate of repairs: \$2,000.00

Our recent collections surrounding Christmas were, indeed, very generous. But that won't get us all the way there when you factor in the \$8,396.06 we need to cover weekly ordinary costs.

# FROM THE PASTOR



I hope you are all surviving the extremely cold weather. You know that it's really cold because *even I* think it has been cold this past week!

As we get to the end of January I do want to tell you the disappointing news that we have decided to continue to suspend public weekend Masses into

the beginning of February. This will continue for the next few weeks until the beginning of Lent.

Public weekend Masses will resume on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>February 20</u> & <u>Sunday February 21</u> for the First Sunday of Lent. At that time we will resume our full Mass schedule with two significant differences: The maximum capacity of the church for public Masses will be **110 people** and the public **rest rooms will remain closed**.

In the mean time the church remains open every day for prayer; daily Mass is celebrated M-F at 9:00AM; Confessions are heard every Saturday from 4:00-4:45PM; we live-stream Mass each Saturday at 5:00PM (and it's available for viewing all weekend) and Holy Communion is distributed every Sunday from 11:00-11:30AM.

As I say, I know this will come as a very great disappointment for many, if not most of you. I know that you desire to get back to coming to Sunday Mass in person and I know that many of you tremendously miss the comfort that worshipping in church with your fellow parishioners brings to you, especially in these times. I don't undertake decisions like this lightly or alone either. There has been a lot of consultation and prayer (including a conversation about it with the bishop) and, while I know this decision is an unpopular one, I feel it is important that if I am going to be in error that it be an error on the side of caution.

I also miss having people in church each weekend. I look forward to seeing you as well as being able to preach the Word of God to you personally rather than through a camera. Nevertheless, right now I think we are better off continuing as we have been until the beginning of Lent. In that holy season of preparation and penance we will be able to resume our full schedule in order to assist people in their Lenten observances and their preparation for a holy Easter.

Please continue to pray for an end to this horrible pandemic.
