DAILY MASS FOR THE SUMMER

Please take note of a temporary change that affects the celebration of daily Mass in our parish. Until the end of August the daily Mass celebrated at 9:00AM Monday - Friday will be celebrated in the Cry Room and not in the main body of the church.

In past years we used to get as many as 25 or even 30 people at daily Mass. This has been slowly dwindling over the years as some daily Mass attendees have become unable to be in church, have moved away or, sadly, have died. The number of daily Mass attendees is now somewhere around 15. In addition, during the warmest summer months it is far easier and more efficient to air condition the smaller Cry Room rather than run the air conditioning for the whole church. This will be a better use of our system so it will be more energy efficient and fiscally responsible.

Happy Fourth of July!

As our country celebrates 245 years of Independence let us all pray for the people of this great nation, its leaders and all those who serve in its Armed

Forces.

The motto on the coat of arms of this country, which is also familiar to most of you from the Great Seal, is "E Pluribus Unum" which means "From many: one". That is the ideal the Founders of this nation and the framers of both the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution were aspiring towards.
