# **HELP THE MISSIONS**

This weekend, at all the Masses, we welcome Rev. Lenin Raj who will be speaking to us about the works of the Latin-Rite Archdiocese of Trivandrum in India which has about 270,000 Catholics. Many of them are recent converts to Christianity from Hinduism. Unemployment and poverty are rampant in this community. The Archdiocese depends on outside assistance to support its clergy, seminarians and lay catechists as well as to develop programs for the faithful.

During the pandemic the situation has been particularly pitiful as fishermen are restricted from fishing and fishwending which is their principal means of income. With income from fishing halted the people are struggling to survive. Local parishes are stressed to support the most vulnerable. There is a great deal of poverty in the villages of the Archdiocese. So, emergency assistance is desperately needed.

Won't you please be as generous as you can in the second collection which will be taken up at all masses this weekend to benefit the Archdiocese of Trivandrum? Your sacrificial gift is appreciated.

# FROM THE PASTOR



This coming week the Church celebrates the *Solemnity of Saints Peter & Paul* on <u>June 29</u>. These two giants of the faith are considered the two equally important "pillars" of the Church in Rome. So important is this feast day that in some

countries it is a holy day of obligation (although it is **not** one of those in the United States). On the Solemnity of Peter & Paul the pope blesses the pallia, a special vestment worn by him and by all Metropolitan Archbishops throughout the world. The pallium is a strip of wool embroidered with six black crosses and worn over the chasuble held in place with three metal pins. It is used on solemn occasions by Metropolitan Archbishops (like the Archbishop of Newark) anywhere within their province and is worn as a sign of sharing in the ministry of the pope as the successor to St. Peter.

Please take note of a temporary change that will affect the celebration of daily Mass in our parish. Beginning July 1 and lasting until the end of August the daily Mass celebrated at 9:00AM Monday - Friday will be celebrated in the Cry Room and not in the main body of the church.

In past years we used to get as many as 25 or even 30 people at daily Mass. This has been slowly dwindling over the years as some daily Mass attendees have become unable to be in church, have moved away or, sadly, have died. The number of daily Mass attendees is now somewhere around 15. In addition, during the warmest summer months it is far easier and more efficient to air condition the smaller Cry Room rather than run the air conditioning for the whole church. This will be a better use of our system so it will be more energy efficient and fiscally responsible.
