FROM THE PASTOR



I hope you all had a happy St. Joseph Day! Congratulations to all of us as we enter into our sesquicentennial year. We are now in *Passiontide* during which we cover the statues in church to focus our attention more on the mysteries we contemplate at Mass.

I also want to extend my good wishes to the 15 young men and women who completed their Religious Education last year and had their confirmation delayed due to the Covid pandemic. They received the Sacrament of Confirmation, which completes their Christian Initiation, on Saturday, March 20. It was my privilege to administer the Sacrament to them as the Bishop's delegate. May the Holy Spirit fill them with the fire of His love and may their lives be filled with blessings and peace.

This coming week the Church celebrates the *Feast of the Annunciation of Our Lord* on March 25. This feast celebrates that moment when the Incarnation of Christ actually began. At the moment the Archangel Gabriel informed Mary she had been chosen to be the Mother of God and she said "yes" the Savior's human life began in her womb by the power of the Holy Spirit.

This is the beginning of our salvation which reaches its climax in the Paschal Mystery of Christ's passion, death and resurrection. The work of our redemption begins quietly in the womb of a faithful young woman and dramatically reaches a climax as a young man hangs dying on the cross to be triumphantly crowned with His glorious resurrection. All because a woman of great faith said, "yes".

In these days when we are preparing to celebrate the Lord's resurrection we take this day to pause and remember how the plan of God's saving actions should have their start in a quiet moment of prayer and of the acceptance of God's will in all things.

By the way, the feast of the Annunciation has been on the Church's calendar since ancient times and on this particular date, March 25. Seeing as it commemorates the moment when Christ's human life started in the womb you simply have to count nine months later and that is how we came to celebrate His birth on December 25, which is actually a much later development in the Church calendar. (No extra charge for the trivial info on the liturgical calendar!) Remember: the liturgical calendar does not concern itself with historical dates and times. Rather, it allows for the celebrations of the mysteries of the faith to unfold throughout the year.
