FROM THE PASTOR



As we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King we once again come to the conclusion of another Church Year. As we spend this “month of the Holy Souls” in November thinking of and praying for the faithful departed we also look to the inevitable destiny that awaits us all when we leave this world to enter a new life. We also reflect on the ending of the world and the passing of all that is. Rather than depressing us we can make these reflections filled with a sense of hope in the eternal life promised to us at Baptism.

That sacred moment of our Baptism when we are literally incorporated into the Mystical Body of Christ —the Church— and are claimed by Christ as His own is something that always renews our hope even in the face of death. This is why we remind ourselves of this Baptism by blessing ourselves with holy water when we physically enter into the church building to pray or celebrate the Sacraments.

During this horrible pandemic one of the restrictions with which we have had to contend was the removal of holy water from our churches. In order to help prevent the spread of disease the communally used holy water stoups have remained empty and dry since March of 2020.

I am happy to say that the Bishop has now granted his consent for us to resume the use of holy water at the discretion of each parish pastor. Starting **next Sunday**, the First Sunday of Advent, and the start of a new Church Year holy water will once again be available in the holy water stoups found near the doors leading from the Narthex into the church. There are two located in the Narthex and one inside just under the entrance bell.

The Baptismal Font itself will remain without holy water in it except when it is being used for the celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism. Despite the long-standing custom here it is not appropriate to use the Baptismal Font itself as the place from which people get holy water on their way in or out of church. It has a specific purpose for the celebration of the Sacrament and it is not to be seen as a fountain, or as a communal holy water stoup. While the Baptismal Font will remain dry the holy water stoups — which are receptacles designed specifically for this purpose—will contain holy water with which people may bless themselves as they wish, starting next Sunday.

NO WEDNESDAY CONFESSIONS

On Wednesday, November 24 there will be no evening Confessions. That day is the day before Thanksgiving.
