

FROM THE PASTOR



A reminder to all of you that this Monday, November 1 is All Saints Day which this year is NOT a day of obligation because it falls on a Monday. There will be 9:00AM Mass that day as usual.

<u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 2:</u> is *The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed* more commonly called *All Souls' Day*. Remember that All Souls' Day is also *not a holy day of obligation*. That day there will be only **one Mass celebrated in the parish at 7:00PM**. This is the Mass where we pray for all the departed and particularly for those who died in the past 12 months. There will be no morning Mass on All Souls' Day.

Tuesday, November 2 is also Election Day. Go vote!

<u>Thursday</u>, <u>November 4:</u> There is a Parish Council Meeting at 7:00PM in the Rectory Meeting Room.

<u>Sunday, November 7:</u> we turn the clocks back one hour and resume Standard Time.

Also, remember that in November our Parish Outreach will be helping to provide food for needy families for the Thanksgiving holiday.

Today is Hallowe'en a day most people associate with ghosts and ghouls but which is, in fact, simply the Eve of All Hallows (i.e. All Saints). It is the time of year we begin to remember those who have gone before us in death; either to heaven (the Saints) or still awaiting final judgement in Purgatory (the Faithful Departed). All during the month of November the Church will be praying for the dead. As the Church year approached its close we are being mindful of the Last Things: Death, Judgement, Heaven and Hell.

In particular in the coming month we will be praying for all those from our parish who have died in the last year and also especially remembering all those buried in our Parish Cemetery.
