

FROM THE PASTOR



This week I received the sad news that two veteran priests of our Diocese passed away. On <u>Saturday</u>, <u>February 5</u> Monsignor Michael Corona, who was formerly the pastor at St. Philip & St. James in Phillipsburg for 30 years, died

while in the hospital. In recent years he had been serving in semi-retirement as pastor of St. Luke in North Plainfield. His funeral took place there on Thursday.

On <u>Sunday, February 6</u> Monsignor Terrence Lawler, the former pastor of St. Mary in Alpha and a native of Phillipsburg died after a short stay in the hospital. Monsignor Lawler had only recently retired last Spring and was in residence at Blessed Sacrament parish in Martinsville. His funeral was on Saturday at St. Philip & St. James. Please pray for the repose of their souls.

Since both of these men were retired or semi-retired their passing, while sad, doesn't have a negative impact on the priest personnel of the Diocese. After many long and faithful years of service they were at the end of their active ministry. Nevertheless, the loss of two priests in the same weekend has served to underscore that we are always in need of more young men to answer the call to service in the priesthood. Please keep that intention in your prayers.

I do not agree with the contention that there don't seem to be as many vocations these days. That would imply that somehow God has changed and isn't calling as many people to service in the Church. I think that's not true. God is calling people now as ever. However, because we have been endowed with a free will by God what has changed is that many more young men these days hear the call and either ignore it or they deliberately choose not to respond to it.

So, our prayers for vocations don't need to focus on trying to get God to change and to call more people. (It's rather typical that we always assume the fault lies with God and not with us, isn't it?) Rather, we all need to pray that faithful young men will have the grace, strength and courage to listen for that call and answer it when it comes. The young men in seminary now are men of character and courage and I admire them. It isn't easy in these troubled times to pursue a vocation to priesthood. Most of their peers won't admire them for it but they have heard the voice of Him who calls them and they have said, "I will go!" We need to support them with our prayers and good wishes.

I hope that you all have a week ahead filled with blessings and peace. I also hope that you and your loved ones are staying healthy. It's good to see the pandemic stats continuing to go down! Keep the Faith!
