CHRISM MASS 2022


On Tuesday, April 12, 2022, Bishop James F. Checchio will celebrate the Chrism Mass with the priests of the diocese. At this Mass, the Bishop will bless and consecrate the Holy Oils, which each parish receives for the rites of anointing. At the Mass, all priests also make a Renewal of Commitment to Priestly Service, recommitting themselves to their Bishop and to their ministry to God and His People. All are invited to watch, via livestream, the ancient, gracefilled Chrism Mass at the Cathedral of St. Francis of Assisi in Metuchen at 4:00 PM.

SOLEMNITY OF THE ASCENSION

Effective this upcoming Easter season, the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord will be permanently transferred from Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter to the following Sunday, the Seventh Sunday of Easter, in all Catholic dioceses in New Jersey. This year, the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord will be observed on Sunday, May 29. This liturgical observance is an

integral dimension of the completion of Our Lord's paschal mystery and, after much discussion, the Catholic Bishops of New Jersey collectively discerned that the transferring the observance to the following Sunday would allow for greater participation among the faithful.

FROM THE PASTOR



Passiontide, the final two weeks of Lent, begins this weekend. This is the time when Lent sort of gets "bumped up" a notch. In these days the statues in our churches are veiled to remind us to focus on the Lord's Passion as we prepare to

celebrate Holy Week and the Paschal Triduum. That can be a jarring sight when you come into church and the statues you are used to seeing are veiled from view. But, that's the whole idea. It serves to shake us up a little and remind us of the significance of the holy days just ahead of us

I don't know about you, but for me this Lent has just seemed to fly by so far. It has been a good Lent this year for me. I really do hope that it has also been one for you. I suppose that from my perspective the previous two Lents were compromised a bit by the pandemic and its restrictions. This year, Lent has seemed much more "normal" to me. Perhaps that's it?

As we move into these closing days of Lent my hope for you all, and also my advice as your spiritual leader, is that you do whatever is necessary to remove the distractions that daily life can impose on us and try, as best you can of course, to spend these last two weeks of Lent living a life of prayer, penance, sacrifice and service. These things which we use in Lent to focus our prayer should also, to some measure, become a part of our lives all year through.

Now, for many people that simply isn't possible or it's so challenging that they find it difficult to maintain. Nevertheless, we should try. Lent isn't just something we do for forty days. It really is the way the life of a Christian should unfold at all times. But, as I say, life is a bit more complex than that and it doesn't always work out. So, whether or not you have been having a really good and spiritually fruitful Lent take the next two weeks and make the extra effort. Do whatever it takes to enter into the spirit of this season of penance and preparation.

Also, a reminder that the Sacrament of Confession is available this coming <u>Wednesday</u>. April 6, from 7:00-8:00PM here in the church. Five priests will be present during that time and the Blessed Sacrament exposed for adoration. NOTE THAT THE FINAL SCHEDULED CONFESSIONS PRIOR TO EASTER will be on <u>Friday</u>, <u>April 8</u> from 7:00 - 8:00PM. After <u>April 8</u> Confession will only be available in an emergency to those in danger of death and they will not resume until <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>April 27</u>.

Have a blessed week and a blessed Lent. Stay healthy and safe and remember above all to Keep the Faith!
